Why was Councillor Cheung's request "charter righted" yesterday evening?

What rationale does the city give for using the proper signs everywhere else in the city, but refusing to use on Western Avenue or River Street?

What more information does the councillor in question need? Why is one policy applied to the rest of the city, but not to Riverside or Cambridgeport? If proof is needed regarding what the neighborhood wants, I have about 200 signatures that tell the council what the neighborhood wants.

Were the neighbors on Cambridge Street asked if they want the Yield to Pedestrians sign that appear at every crosswalk there? What about the neighbors on the other streets with the signs?

Furthermore, during the long, drawn out construction period, why are there no traffic control officers on Western Avenue at all intersections to prevent gridlock?

(The two traffic control officers that were stationed down by Memorial Drive for a few weeks were not performing any traffic control duties, but rather were texting on their cell phones, chatting with each other, or looking off into space.)
