
**The Homelessness Shelter Known as "Bread and Jams."**

The homelessness shelter known as "Bread and Jams," after having their federal funding cut by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), has been forced to relocate from their present dwelling ( 50 Quincy St, Cambridge, MA 02138) to a new venue, if they are able to find a new home. Bread and Jams purpose and use in Harvard Square for years, has been to faithfully provide homeless individuals with a safe, supportive drop-in environment, where they could get off the street; address basic needs for hygiene, nutrition and clothing; and access case management and other supportive services furnished by program staff and staff from our other homeless programs. Now without the possibility of a home, these valuable community services for the homeless won't be provide any longer.

My purpose here is to inquire into the possibility of securing space at the Foundry Building for setting up a new home and location for Bread and Jams. This would be in concord with the City of Cambridge's 10 year planning to end homelessness. I believe a petition is in the works to be presented to the City Council soon,
