Subject: Pearl Street Reconstruction

Dear City Council:

I am writing regarding Cambridge's Pearl Street reconstruction project. In the beginning, there were two options for Pearl Street: status-quo versus a protected bicycle lane that would require removal of parking on one side. After a year of public process hearing many sides of the issue, City Staff proposed a compromise option that would provide for a buffered bike lane during the day and residential parking at night.

Though I am in full support of the full-time protected bike lane option, the compromise option seems to be a reasonable alternative that gives each side something, but not everything. Please do not support the Council Order that negates a year of public process and forces a one-sided solution.

Please vote against Toomey and Benzan's Order which would remove a design alternative outside of the public process. This is not the right approach to this issue, no matter how contentious. The final design does not need to be determined today, and city staff are committed to continuing the community process to determine a final design.

The trends are clear: Cambridge residents are relying less on private automobiles and more on public transportation, biking, and walking. The number of cars registered in Cambridgeport has dropped by 10% since 2000 even as population has increased. This project must invest in a future that improves the quality of life in our city by making more transportation options available to more people.

I use this corridor as a bicycle route regularly to get from my apartment in East Cambridge to my parents home in Brookline, and feel that a buffered bike lane with night parking (when parking is used the most) is the least the city can do to make me and the many other cyclists in the area feel safer.
