The 26th stamp in the Black Heritage series commemorates Thurgood Marshall who was a civil rights lawyer for many years before becoming the first African American to serve as solicitor general of the United States. In 1967, Marshall was sworn in as the first African American of the U.S. Supreme Court and continued in that capacity until he retired in January 1993. On November 30, 1993, our country's highest civilian honor, the presidential medal of freedom, was awarded to Thurgood Marshall
