The CHIP identification materials include: **VIDEOTAPE:** A brief videotaped interview that can be quickly distributed to the media in order to reach a huge audience. **FINGERPRINTS:** Fingerprinting is a well-known means of identification. Resourceful parents keep fingerprints available should the need arise. **TOOTHPRINTS:** A toothprint bite impression is quick and easy. Teeth, like fingerprints are unique. A dental imprint gives both accurate and important information for identification purposes. **ALL ID MATERIALS ARE KEPT BY THE CHILD'S FAMILY!**
