

The Preschool Program consists of 2 classes under the direction of the Head Teacher, Teacher, and Classroom Assistants. Your child will participate in many activities such as: summer reading, arts & crafts, storytelling, sprinkler & pool, games, performances, field trips, beginner math skills, and other leisure time activities.

The summer program is divided into three sessions. **Fees for one session is due at the time of registration.** Please be prepared to pay a \$240.00 **non-refundable** deposit for one session of preschool day or \$320.00 regular day option. A \$190.00 fee is due for each session of extended day. There is a \$20.00 registration fee that will help provide your child with a camp T-shirt and hat.

Our program consists of 4 classrooms (1 5-6yrs., 1 6-7yrs., 1 8-9yrs., 1 10-13yrs.) under the direction of the Head Teacher, Teacher, and Classroom Assistants. Children are divided into separate age groups to allow them to participate in age appropriate activities such as: arts & crafts, tennis lessons, City Sprouts gardening, soccer, summer reading, weekly field trips, stage performances, swimming, bowling, fun math games, music and other leisure and recreational activities.

Fitzgerald Summer Fun

1) Color Day

Every Monday the Fitzgerald Summer Camp and the Peabody Pre-School join together for a morning of fun and play. These activities teach important life skills such as Sportsmanship, Effort, and Teamwork. The activities planned lead up to our annual Color Day Event celebrated with an awards luncheon for all participants.

2) Peabody School Gardening / Art Projects

In collaboration with City Sprouts, weekly visits to our school garden provide children with exploration of the great outdoors. NOCA Artist, Janet Hobbs and our staff educate the children through planting, digging, identifying insects and their jobs, watercolor painting and arts and craft activities.

4) Weekly Field Trips - Every Wednesday is field trip day. Please note: Not all classes go on all the trips.

Preteen Group: Every Friday the older group takes the MBTA to explore the city of Boston’s “Free Fridays” and all it has to offer. The group visits the JFK Museum, New England Sports Museum, Faneuil Hall and George’s Island. The children learn how to navigate in and out of Boston by reading maps, bus routes, schedules, estimate the cost of trip, estimate arrival, departure and return home time.
