

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Welcome to our fall semester with the Morse Community School, a program of the City of Cambridge, Department of Human Services (D.H.S.P). We are pleased that you have decided to become a member with us. The Morse Community School program is proud of our work with members of the community in creating exciting and successful enrichment programs. We hope that you have enjoyed your summer vacation and feel ready for a new school year with some fun filled enrichment classes (please see schedule in back for a complete listing with class descriptions included in the middle of this brochure). The enrichment classes are scheduled to begin on Monday, September 19, 2011 and will continue until Friday, December 22, 2011 (a 14-week semester). Once you register for a class the fee(s) are for the duration of the semester. You will not need to register again until January if you choose to continue your membership with us. Please complete the registration form on the back of this brochure for enrichment classes only or the Jump Start form for the week of September 12-16 for that week only. Then return the form along with a full payment or a written payment plan with specific dates of payment. It is a program requirement that forms and payments be received before a child begins the fall semester. Please adhere to the program policy or expect delays with your child receiving services.

Snack will be served to all children registered for classes during the time of 3:45-4:00. We will offer a variety of age appropriate classes every hour from 2:45-6:00. Registration will start on September 1, 2011 through Thursday, September 8, 2011. During this time our office will be open from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. (by appointment only) and 1:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. for enrichment class sign up. The last day to register for classes is Thursday, September 8<sup>th</sup> 2011. Classes will be dropped if minimal enrollment is not obtained. Please note we will notify you only if you are closed out of a class. For your convenience we will offer structured Jump Start Activities and demonstrations of classes during the week of September 12-16, 2011. The enrichment classes will begin on September 19, 2011. Full payment is required at the time of registration. Please make check payable to the Morse Community School and include your child's name on the check. **Returned checks will be charged an additional \$25.00. Full payment must be received within 48 hours to avoid disrupting your child's program schedule.** Partial financial assistance is available for income-qualified students. Please request an application from Stan Rogers. No family will receive any financial assistance without completing the financial aid process.

Thank you again for choosing the Morse Community School program. Parents are invited to participate in our Neighborhood Council meeting, and the first of the season is on Tues Oct 18th at 6:00 pm. Dinner will be served and childcare provided. The goal is to give feedback about the program and plan for future events. We look forward to working with you and your family this fall. ## General Information and Policies

### Registration Policy

1. If you wait, you may be too late! Please sign up by the registration deadline **Thursday, September 8, 2011**, as space is limited. Classes will be cancelled if minimal enrollment is not achieved by the registration deadline. Late registration will be accepted subject to availability only. **All registrations are accepted on a first come first served basis.** There is a \$20.00 registration fee per child, per academic school year to cover administration costs. Classes cannot be attended until the following is received:

- **Registration form (with Class List)**
- **Emergency card**
- **DHSP/IEP Consent form (Individual Education Plan) if applicable**
- **A written payment plan specifying payment dates is developed or full payment is received**

\* If an emergency card & DHSP/IEP form is already on file from Camp Big Adventure 2011, then you do not have to complete another.

2. You may only drop a class after the first full week. After the first week no refunds will be made unless certified medical documentation is received. All changes must be made in writing/emails only, no phone calls or voicemail.

3. The Morse Community School reserves the right to cancel or consolidate classes that do not support themselves financially. All programs operate on a self-supporting basis and must obtain a minimal enrollment in order to operate for a semester.

4. Confirmation of your classes will not be made. You will be notified only if you are not in a class due to either full enrollment or class cancellation. Your cancelled check is your receipt.

5. A full participant list will be posted on the sign-out table located in the main lobby. With advance notice you may also request a copy of your child's schedule.

6. To be certain your child participates fully in the classes, please discuss the schedule with your child and encourage him/her to choose classes based on his/her own interests. Choosing classes for your child could possibly lead to him/her demonstrating unacceptable behaviors indicating a lack of interest. If at any point you and your child decide a class change is needed, please make requests in writing.

7. Please remember classes are enrolled on a first come first served basis, especially individual music lessons. Students will be scheduled only when all paperwork is completed and payments are paid in full (or a written payment plan with specific dates is received). Any family with an outstanding balance will not be able to enroll in the next semester.

8. Enrollment will be ongoing after the registration deadline of Thursday, September 8, 2011 per availability of classes that are not fully enrolled.

### **The Morse Neighborhood Council**

The Community School Program at the Morse is seeking local parents of the after school program to serve on the Neighborhood Council. Council membership is open to all participants of the Morse School and the surrounding neighborhood. The goal of the Council is to meet regularly (Tuesday, October 18 & Tuesday, December 13) with the Community School Director to address the needs of the Community School Program & neighborhood. ### **The Morse Community School provides:**

- After school enrichment classes for children, adults and families.
- Community field trips, special events and family nights

### **Community School Pick-up when school day ends**

Participants with completed registration forms will be picked up in their individual classrooms. This is the pickup process for preschoolers – second graders only. The older grades (3-8) should come directly to our designated meeting place (cafeteria) after dismissal from class for the day. A list of children enrolled in the classes will be given to your child's teacher after the conclusion of the first week of classes. We have three scheduled pick up times 4:00 pm, 5:00 pm or 6:00 pm. Parents must pick up children at their designated pick up time or will be charged a late fee. Children are not permitted to attend any classes until the registration process is completed.

### **Late Fee**

The Morse Community School late fee is \$1.00 per minute, as measured by the classroom clock for every minute after the program end time (4:00 pm, 5:00 pm or 6:00 pm). Late fees must be paid within 48 hours or the child cannot return to the program. Please call the program cell phone at (617) 820-7458 to inform the Director if you are going to be late in order to make the waiting less stressful for everyone; however calling does not waive your late fee. Excessive lateness may result in suspension of services.

Please assist us by picking up your child promptly at the end of his/her class or make other arrangements to have your child picked up on time.

### **Sign-out Table**

When you pick up your child at the end of his/her day, please sign him/her out at the sign-out table located in the main lobby by the cafeteria. Program updates and community information will be posted on the sign-out table. Please check the table daily for changes in the schedule and other important information.

### **Community School Closings**

Community Schools are not open on public school holidays or when schools are closed due to inclement weather or emergencies.

### Early Release Days

Regular scheduled classes will not be held on early release days. A special activity or field trip will be planned for an additional cost. A flyer outlining activities for the early release day will be distributed throughout the school prior to the day's event.

### Payment Procedures

Full payment is required at registration; however, we can arrange a payment plan with individual families. All outstanding debts must be paid before your child is registered for classes. If a family has any outstanding balance due to any DHSP program, your child may not register for classes until all outstanding payments are up to date. Checks or money orders should be made payable to MORSE COMMUNITY SCHOOL with the child's name on the check. **Returned checks will be charged an additional \$25.00. Full payment must be received within 48 hours to avoid disrupting your child's program schedule.**

### Refunds & Cancellations

Full refunds will be given for any classes cancelled by the Community School Program. A full refund will be given if a class is dropped after the first week. Partial refunds will be given if a child is no longer able to participate due to medical reasons with appropriate medical documentation. Classes with insufficient enrollment will be cancelled, in which case a replacement class may be selected or a full refund will be issued.

### Scholarship

A limited number of scholarships are available. Please request a financial aid application from Stan Rogers in room D46 during the hours of 1:00-5:00pm. Documentation of income will be required with requests for scholarship. We welcome your contribution to assist us with scholarships for families who are in need of support. In order to increase our scholarship funding, please consider a donation to the MORSE COMMUNITY SCHOOL for this purpose.

### Volunteer Opportunities

Volunteers are needed to assist with homework, teach an enrichment class, chaperone an early release day trip, and assist with planning or organizing a special event. Because of the nature of our program all volunteers require a CORI background check. Please consider becoming a volunteer today!
