SUMMER IN THE CITY

Enjoy a wide array of FREE, multicultural, interactive arts programs, performances, and activities both day and night for children, families, and the entire community in parks and open spaces throughout Cambridge. (See page 16 for the full schedule.)

CAC GRANT PROGRAM

Artists and arts organizations can apply to receive funding for projects that benefit the citizens of Cambridge. Applications are available beginning in August, and are due in October.

PUBLIC ART

With 200 permanent artworks throughout the city, Cambridge has the largest contemporary public art collection in the Commonwealth. Cambridge is the only city in the Commonwealth with a Percent-for-Art ordinance that designates a portion of construction costs for capital improvements to support integrated, site-responsive public art.

CAC GALLERY

Step inside the gallery, located in the City Hall Annex, to experience exhibitions that explore art in the public realm and encourage community engagement and dialogue.

POET POPULIST PROGRAM

Elected by residents, the Cambridge Poet Populist works with the Cambridge Public Library, schools, artists, and local cultural organizations to promote and encourage a dynamic relationship with poetry.

STREET PERFORMER PROGRAM

Live performances give character to parks and enliven the city's public spaces. If you are interested in performing, visit our office to apply for a permit. No audition is required, and permits are good for the calendar year.

CAMBRIDGE OPEN STUDIOS

Each spring, discover an array of art that emerges from artists' studios and other unique spaces throughout the City. Much of the work is available for purchase, which is a great way to support local artists and bring art into your home or workspace.

PARADE BEGINS 11:20 AM Meet in Winthrop Park to celebrate the opening of the 2011 Cambridge River Festival with Revels singers, musicians and puppeteers. Join in singing great songs, including "Down by the Riverside," accompanied by the irresistible groove of New Orleans-style honk band, Dirty Water Brass Band. After this opening ceremony, follow the giant puppet of local legend Brother Blue, created by Behind the Mask Theater, along with a majestic burst of puppet butterflies down to the riverside. Everyone is invited to participate in the parade. Bring a drum or a kazoo! If you think you can't carry a tune, carry a puppet!

A doorway into the rich and diverse musical cultural traditions of Ecuador, ÑAWI blends modern elements with a deeply rooted folkloric foundation. Utilizing a wide range of traditional instruments from Ecuador and South America, as well as mandolin, violin, piano, electronic keyboards and electric bass, the group performs both instrumental and sung pieces.

1:30 PM MAKANDA PROJECT

The Makanda Project celebrates Makanda Ken McIntyre, a brilliant multi-instrumentalist, composer, and educator. In a distinguished career that spanned from the late 1950s until his sudden passing in 2001, he became very highly regarded within the jazz world for his own recordings and compositions as well as his contributions to recordings by Eric Dolphy and Cecil Taylor, among others. Band members include Kurtis Rivers and Arni Cheatham, alto saxophone; Lance Bryant and Sean Berry, tenor saxophone and flute; Charlie Kohlhas, baritone saxophone; Jerry Sabatini, trumpet, flugelhorn; Josiah Woodson, trumpet and flute; Robert Stringer, trombone; Bill Lowe, bass trombone and tuba; John Kordalewski, piano; John Lockwood, bass; and Yoron Israel, drums.

3 PM NEW WORLD JAZZ COMPOSERS OCTET

Daniel Ian Smith's octet is dedicated to the performance of new music. Having given their first performances under the guise of the "Sanctuary Composers Forum" in tandem with the "Jazz in the Sanctuary" concert series which featured jazz and improvised music, the group garnered considerable attention, and word spread that this world-class ensemble was truly one of a kind. The ensemble quickly adapts to and personalizes the compositions that are written expressly for it. They will present music from their latest recording project, *Transitions*.

4:30 PM KENDRICK OLIVER'S NEW LIFE JAZZ ENSEMBLE

Inspired by Big Band greats Count Basie, Duke Ellington, and Dizzie Gillespie, this New England-based group combines Basie-style swing, foot-stompin', head-bobbin' arrangements with high-powered rhythms, an unrestrained brass section, elegant vocals and a talented assortment of spectacular soloists to produce its infectious sound. Rooted in Gospel music, this outstanding Jazz Ensemble will have you dancing along and shouting out for more from the first song to the last note.

12 NOON MARGARET GLASPY

Born and raised in rural Northern California, Margaret Glaspy, singer/songwriter came to Boston a few years ago on a grant from the National Foundation for the Advancement of Arts, and plays regularly at Club Passim and the Lizard Lounge. Her credits also include performances at the John F. Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C. and New York City's Ziegfeld Theatre. She counts Ray Charles, Joni Mitchell, and James Taylor among the artists who have won her old soul at a young age.

1 PM DIETRICH STRAUSE

Dietrich Strause has been drawing in Boston audiences with poetic lyrics brought to life through his flowing finger-picking guitar, a mellifluously woven viola, and the pulse of a roots heartbeat. His band features some of the Boston area's finest musicians, Billy Beard (Session Americana), Jim Larkin (Jesse Dee), and Laurence Scudder (The Ryan Montbleau Band).

2 PM DARLINGSIDE

Darlingside is a string rock quintet, based in Northampton, Mass., that features lush five-part harmonies, classical cello-violin duets and compelling break-beats. The band keeps audiences on their toes with their exuberant stage presence, spontaneous a cappella, frequent instrument switches, mind-boggling covers and a widely eclectic, cross-genre blend of original material.

3 PM SARAH BORGES

Known to many nationwide due to relentless touring with her fiery rockin' band, The Broken Singles, Sarah has drawn praise throughout the country, including accolades from the *Boston Globe* ("the playfully charismatic Borges truly shines"), *Time Out New York* ("irresistible") and the *Milwaukee Journal Sentinel* ("just a whole lot of fun"). The band received raves in the *New York Times* for their "vivacious" live show. Borges was awarded "Local Female Vocalist of the Year" at the 2008 Boston Music Awards.

4 PM RYAN FITZSIMMONS

While still a relative newcomer to Providence, Rhode Island, Ryan Fitzsimmons was nominated for Best Folk Act for 2004. In 2007, he was awarded "Best Male Vocalist" in the Providence Phoenix Best Music Poll. He has performed at the Newport Folk Festival, Falcon Ridge Folk Festival, and many other venues throughout New England, including Cambridge's TOAD and The Lizard Lounge. He is currently finishing his second CD with David "Goody" Goodrich (Chris Smither and Peter Mulvey).

5 PM FANDANGO

Fandango is as much a spiritual renewal as it is a reinterpretation of some of the best soul, blues, gospel, and Americana music ever written. At their weekly Wednesday night residency at TOAD, Fandango frontman Fred Griffeth leads this congregation into soul and R&B righteousness! Fandango also includes Steve Cuoco on bass, Chris Anzalone on drums, Cliff Spencer on organ with Bob Enik and Kevin Belz sharing guitar duties.
