Minutes of the Cambridge Election Commissioners meeting Friday, January 29, 2010

The meeting of the Cambridge Election Commission was called to order by Commissioner Bonislawski at 4:00 PM Tuesday, January 29, 2010 at the Cambridge Election Commission Offices at 51 Inman St., Cambridge. Commissioners Bonislawski, Cobb, King and Sheinfeld were present. Election Commission Executive Director Marsha Weinerman, George Goverman Election Auditor, Karen Francis, Barbara Morales, Dave Ryan, and Leslie Waxman Esq., from the Election Commission staff were on hand.

Commissioner Sheinfeld moved to accept as edited the minutes of the meetings of January 6th and 19th. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Bonislawski and passed 4-0.

Commissioner Cobb reported that 182 Raymond St. is a valid address and that she had executed ballots for approximately 15 voters at the Neville Center on Concord Av.

Commissioner Sheinfeld reported that 60 Putnam Gardens was not a valid address and he had executed ballots with 19 voters at the Sancta Maria nursing facility on Concord Av.

Commissioner Bonislawski reported that 125 Harvard St. is a valid address and that she had executed one ballot at the Youville facility on Cambridge St.

Commissioner King reported that he had executed 18 ballots at Cambridge Homes on Mt. Auburn St.

The executive Director's report was presented and is in the attached agenda.

The Executive Director noted that she had received an e-mail from a voter regarding the Thorndike St. Polling location. The Executive Director contacted the voter who did not respond.

The Executive Director announced that the following schedule for ballot packing and poll worker training had been developed for the special election.

The Board of Election Commissioners then reviewed 71 provisional ballots of which 27 were counted. There were 38 late domestic absentee ballots which were not counted. 30 Overseas absentee ballots were reviewed by the board. 20 of them were counted and the remaining 10 were deemed invalid and rejected.
