

The City of Cambridge has been awarded a state Department of Energy Resources grant to install seven electric vehicle (EV) charging stations. Cambridge is one of 25 communities throughout Massachusetts that will receive EV charging stations through a public-private partnership between the state and Coulomb Technologies. Expected to be installed this fall, the EV charging stations will be located throughout Cambridge in publicly accessible areas. The installation of charging stations will help the City of Cambridge advance its climate protection strategy by encouraging a shift from internal combustion vehicles to electric vehicles.
